

Annual Review of Export Receipts (2012-2013)

Overall Trends

Total export receipts of Bangladesh (including exports of EPZ) during the financial years, 2012-2013 and 2011-2012 amounted to Tk. 189659.7 crore and Tk. 180310.0 crore or US \$ 23757.6 million and US \$ 22843.5 million respectively.

The overall position of export receipts in Taka and US dollar for the years 2012-2013, 2011-2012 and 2010-2011 are shown in tables 1(A) {Taka in crore} and 1(B){In million US\$} respectively.

Exports on Cash Terms (Excluding EPZ)

Export earnings in 2012-2013 stood at Tk. 159110.8 crore as against Tk. 153224.5 crore in the preceding year. The main items of cash exports during the year under review were readymade garments (Tk. 128269.2 crore), jute manufactures (Tk. 5987.8 crore), leather and leather manufactures (Tk. 5398.8 crore), Fish, shrimps and prawns (Tk. 3580.2 crore), raw jute (Tk. 1681.3 crore), furnace oil, naphtha & bitumen (petroleum and petroleum products) (Tk. 825.1 crore), handicrafts (Tk. 52.1 crore), tea (Tk. 18.2 crore) and fertilizer (Tk. 0.6 crore). The major partner countries were the U.S.A (Tk. 29720.0 crore), Germany (Tk. 25105.0 crore), the U.K (Tk. 16235.0 crore), France (Tk. 9862.0 crore), Spain (Tk. 7302.0 crore), Italy (Tk. 6316.0 crore), Canada (Tk. 6773.0 crore), India (Tk. 4311.0 crore), Netherlands (Tk. 4284.0 crore), Belgium (Tk. 4204.0 crore) and Turkey (Tk. 4189.0 crore).

Commodity- wise Export Receipts (Excluding EPZ)

During the year 2012-2013 the earnings through traditional items i.e. jute manufactures (Tk. 5987.8 crore), raw jute (Tk. 1681.3 crore) and tea-all sorts (Tk. 18.2 crore) and through non-traditional items Tk. 151423.5 crore. Among the non-traditional items, readymade garments have emerged individually as the most important sector. Readymade garments accounted for Tk. 128269.2 crore (80.6 %) in 2012-2013 as compared to Tk. 120147.3 crore (78.4 %) in 2011-2012.

Commodity classification of export earnings for the current year revealed increases over the previous year under : readymade garments including hosiery (Tk. 8121.9 crore), leather and leather manufactures (Tk. 1133.9 crore), jute manufactures (Tk. 787.8 crore), Pharmaceutical products (74.4 crore), Bicycle (55.1 crore), Handicrafts (10.0 crore) and on the other hand export earnings through fish shrimps and prawns (Tk. 1178.0 crore), Home textile (292.4 crore), raw jute (Tk. 184.7 crore), furnace oil, naphtha & bitumen (Tk. 146.7 crore), fertilizers (Tk. 129.2 crore) and tea (Tk. 10.4 crore) were decreased.

Direction of Exports (Excluding EPZ):

As regard the destinational pattern of exports, the U.S.A. were the most prominent buyer which bought goods worth Tk. 29720.0 crore (18.7%) during the year under review as compared to Tk. 30021.6 crore (19.6%) and Tk. 26829.0 crore (21.5%) in the previous year 2011-2012 and 2010-2011 respectively. The principal items of export to the U.S.A were readymade garments (Tk. 27833.0 crore), fish, shrimps & prawns (Tk. 305.0 crore), jute manufactures (Tk. 135.0 crore), leather and leather manufactures (Tk. 86.0 crore), raw jute (Tk. 11.0 crore) and handicrafts (Tk. 11.0 crore).

The second largest buyer of Bangladeshi goods was Germany amounted to Tk. 25105.0 crore (15.8%) during the year under review as compared to Tk. 25095.8 crore (16.4%) and Tk. 19455.7 crore (15.6%) during 2011-2012 and 2010-2011 respectively. The major items of export to Germany were: readymade garments (Tk. 23042.0 crore), fish, shrimps & prawns (Tk. 365.0 crore), jute manufactures (Tk. 54.0 crore), leather & leather manufactures (Tk. 505.0 crore), raw jute (Tk. 16.0 crore) and handicrafts (Tk. 6.0 crore).

The next important trading partner was the U.K. Export earnings from U.K. amounted to Tk. 16235.0 crore (10.2%) during the year 2012-2013 as compared to Tk. 15800.8 crore (10.3%) and Tk. 11395.2 crore (9.1%) in the previous year 2011-2012 and 2010-2011 respectively. The main items of exports to the U.K. were readymade garments (Tk. 14338.0 crore), fish, shrimps & prawns (Tk. 650.0 crore), jute manufactures (Tk. 34.0 crore), leather & leather manufactures (Tk. 38.0 crore), raw jute (Tk. 14.0 crore) and handicraft (Tk. 6.0).

France purchased goods worth Tk. 9862.0 crore (6.2%) during the year under review. The shares of Spain in export receipts during 2012-2013 and 2011-2012 were Tk. 7302.0 crore (4.6 %) and Tk. 7056.1 crore (4.6%) respectively.

Canada, Italy, India, Netherlands , Belgium and Turkey followed by descending order of magnitude in respect of our export earnings and accounted for Tk. 6773.0 crore (4.3%), Tk. 6316.0 crore (4.0 %),Tk.4311.0 crore (2.7%) ,Tk. 4284.0 crore (2.7%), Tk. 4204.0 crore (2.6%) and Tk. 4189.0 crore (2.6 %) respectively.

Destinational pattern of exports by bloc/group/community (Excluding EPZ):

The destinational pattern of exports revealed that the EU member countries topped the buyers' list sharing Tk. 85711.1 crore (53.9%) of the total exports during the year under review as against Tk. 85257.6 crore (55.6%) in the preceding year.

The second largest buyer of Bangladeshi goods was the member countries of NAFTA. The shares of NAFTA was Tk. 37265.5 crore (23.4%) of the total exports as compared to Tk. 36779.2 crore (24.0%) during 2011-2012.

Other Asian countries imported Bangladeshi goods worth Tk. 10279.8 crore (6.5%) during the year 2012-2013 as against Tk. 8340.0 crore (5.4%) during the previous year.

The OIC countries share was Tk. 10184.5 crore (6.4%) as against Tk. 9440.0 crore (6.2%) during the previous year.

Other European countries, ACU member countries, SAARC, OPEC and ASEAN countries accounted for Tk. 7445.0 crore (4.7%), Tk. 5839.5 crore (3.7%), Tk. 5212.2 crore (3.3 %), Tk. 3490.9 crore (2.2 %) and Tk. 2878.5 crore (1.8%) respectively of the total export receipts during the year 2012-2013.

Table-4(A) {Taka in crore} &4(B) {In million US\$} shows the comparative position of export receipts from countries classified in a block/group/economic community during 2012-2013 and 2011-2012 along with their respective shares in the total export receipts of Bangladesh.

Export of Export Processing Zones (EPZ):

In order to achieve rapid economic growth of the country by increasing the inflow of foreign investment, particularly through industrialization, special steps have been taken since 1980 by setting up Export processing Zones (EPZ) in the country. Initially three special zones were set up in Chittagong (Halishahar), Dhaka (Savar) and Khulna (Mongla) where favorable facilities/assistance are provided to the potential investors both Bangladeshi and foreigners. The Chittagong Export Processing Zone (CEPZ) started from 1983-84 while the Dhaka Export Processing Zone (DEPZ) started from 1993-94. Later, EPZs have also been established in Mongla of Khulna, Ishwardi of Pabna , Comilla, Uttara of Syedpur in the district of Nilphamary, Adamjee of Narayanganj and Karnaphuli of Chittagong which are classified into three types of enterprises i.e. A-type (100% foreign investment), B-type (Joint venture between Bangladeshi and foreigners) and C-type (100% Bangladeshi enterprises).

At the end of June, 2013 type-wise number of functioning enterprise are shown in Table-5.
